Hancock County Savings Bank Funds Computers



At a time when our computers and our software were beginning to cause some real difficulties with costly repairs and outdated programs, the Hancock County Savings Bank Charitable Foundation came to our rescue with a \$2,000 grant. Family Connections was included in a group of approximately twenty local

charitable and community organizations who made application and were approved for funding for the 2010 cycle of grant applications. Outpatient Clinic Shares Space with Local Psychiatrist

Family Connections' counseling services, located in Weirton Medical Center's Medical Offices Building, and Brooke Place, our residential program for adolescent girls, complies with a myriad of state regulations, policies, and protocols. All contribute to and ensure the health, welfare and safety of those we serve. One individual who assists us in the work we do is Dr. Richard A. Ajayi.

Dr. Ajayi, a board certified psychiatrist who has a practice in cognitive medicine, has been associated with Family Connections since 2008 providing medication management and oversight for our Brooke Place girls. He, along with Jacqueline Jones McDaniel, Certified Registered Nurse Practitioner, visit Brooke Place to meet face to face with our residents and review their files. They are also available to us for consultation.

Dr. Ajayi's association with Brooke Place fulfills a very important WV Department of Health and Human Resources, Bureau of Children and Families regulation, that children who are prescribed certain medications are closely followed by a physician.

Utilizing our clinic site at the Medical Center Building, Dr. Ajayi with Jacqueline McDaniel, CRNP, see individuals from his practice two evenings a week. We are pleased have Dr. Ajayi and Nurse McDaniel share our space and hope we are assisting him with his practice as much as he assists us with our services.

Brooke Place-WVU Landscaping Project



In previous newsletters, we've been keeping you to up to date about our collaboration with WVU and Professor Peter Butler's Landscape Architecture students who produced site designs for the development of the woodsy area surrounding Brooke Place, our residential treatment facility for adolescent girls. While we have records of the young women who have passed through our doors, we realize there are more satisfactory ways to recognize their contributions to our program and their successes in goal achievement, ways that might inspire girls in the future to make positive contributions as well. The idea for an honor garden was born, and has become the centerpiece of a wellness property development project that will include opportunities for exercise, athletics, gardening, and environmental education. To this end, the WVU students visited our site, surveyed the property, spoke to our staff and our girls, and ultimately developed a final design product which fulfills the initial phase of the project.

Some of the proposed exercise and athletic designs include trails, swings, and a multi-purpose court for badminton, volleyball, and basketball. Gardening is one of the surest ways to encourage our girls to make healthier eating choices. The environmental education component is one of the exciting bonuses of partnering with WVU. Outdoor classroom activities could include water conservation, habitat development, and watershed flow.

We are initiating the next phase which is putting the theoretical plan to its practical application. A local architect will be secured and the plan will be partitioned into phases with careful thought as to "what comes first." We will search for grants and donations to assist us in accomplishing the step by step phases of this large project.
